We are pleased to announce the top three programs which will benefit from the largest portion of the funds raised this year:



Community's Child- Hunger Heroes

Community's Child is a non-denominational organization supporting women and infants. Las Candalistas is helping support their *Hunger Heroes Healthy Bags* program, which provides weekend meals for food insecure children. These children receive breakfast and lunch through school programs, but often have no food on the weekends or the summer months when there is no school. Las Candalistas is proud to be a sponsor of this program which will feed 250 children (and up to 350 siblings) in the Lomita and Torrance elementary schools.



Family Promise

The goal of Family Promise is to help homeless families in transition achieve sustainable independence by providing short term shelter, meals, case management, and hospitality. The families spend their nights in the community rooms of various churches and synagogues for a week at a time, shifting to the next location on Sunday morning.

Las Candalistas is supporting Family Promise by helping them purchase a van that would be used to transport families they serve to and from the host locations where they spend the night and take them to jobs, school or to the Day Center to work on their particular case plans. The van would also be used to transport families during the day to appointments and services as needed.



Toberman Neighborhood Center

Toberman Neighborhood Center, founded in 1903, is committed to assisting Harbor Area families by delivering life-changing services that encourage, inform, educate and empower them to live healthy and purposeful lives. Their primary programs include the FamilySource Center; Children, Youth & Family services including academic enrichment; Family Literacy/Learning Program; and Gang Intervention/Prevention services.

Las Candalistas is sponsoring their "Mountain and Sea Adventures" for 12-15 youths (ages 10 through 15) as part of their Gang Prevention Program. Enrollees are assessed and identified as being at significantly high risk of joining gangs. This is a 6-day summer camp experience where they will live aboard a marine research vessel off Catalina Island which would open up a whole new world of possibilities as well as exposure to future career options for them

*We will also support donation requests from Marine Mammal Care, Ride to Fly, and Trinity Kids Care Hospice.

We are pleased to introduce one of our featured speakers for our 2017 Spring Event, "Out of Africa", Humanitarian Award winning author and philanthropist:
LINDA ECKERBOM COLE



In 2006, Linda Cole founded the Community Action Fund for Women in Africa (CAFWA). It is a small non-profit organization in Uganda that seeks to empower women after war by providing them with the technical skills, education, agricultural knowledge and microfinance training they need to succeed.

Women carry the heaviest post-conflict burden and are key to rebuilding war torn communities. For the women who were forced to participate in the conflicts, the return home is difficult. Many return to areas where the infrastructure has been destroyed and access to health care, education and employment is tenuous. They are often stigmatized and their children may be rejected from the community. Because women are traditionally caretakers and responsible for running their households, access to these resources is critical for survival. CAFWA works in partnership with community groups to improve the lives of women in post-war areas of Africa. Believing that women should be active participants in determining their path to success, CAFWA builds on initiatives that the women themselves have started. When women are actively involved in decision making, their voices ensure that vital societal priorities are upheld.

Linda Cole has extensive experience in assessing community needs, preventative health-care and small -scale farming. Linda has a Master's degree in Humanitarian Assistance from Tufts University. She is the co-author of "Women, Girls, Disarmament, Demobilization and Reintegration" with Dyan Mazurana, published in "Women and Wars." Linda is the recipient of the 2014 Leah Horowitz Humanitarian Award. She is in the process of changing the name of the organization from CAFWA to African Women Rising - a name that reflects the positive impact the organization has on the women it serves to lift up from dire circumstances.
