#### **PHILANTHROPY**

Our Top Six charities were selected by the Philanthropy Committee in August. Representatives from each have been invited to our October general meeting to present both their mission and program(s) for which they have requested funding. Following these presentations and after the representatives have left, we will have a few minutes for members to share any additional facts/experiences they may have. A brief summary is provided here, but if any member is interested in viewing a full copy of the charities completed applications, please email me at <a href="mosher120@yahoo.com">mosher120@yahoo.com</a>. I'm happy to forward a copy to you. Voting on the Top Three will take place after the brief members' discussion time.

Our Top Six charities are:

#### 1736 Family Crisis: South Bay Children's Program

1736 Family Crisis Center provides intensive children's services through unique programming provided at one domestic violence shelter, one outpatient clinic, and one 24/7 crisis hotline, within the boundaries of the Las Candalistas funding area. The South Bay Children's Program combines age- and developmentally-appropriate mental health therapy including clinical assessment and treatment with therapeutic activities (e.g., psychotherapy, art therapy, play therapy, gardening, and free play) provided by and/or under the supervision of licensed mental health professionals. Additional services are provided on an individualized basis, dependent on the specific needs of each child, and may include parent-child therapy, school enrollment and tutoring, referral to medical and dental resources, and other essential aid necessary to address all child needs (e.g. housing, food, education, and legal services when applicable). Serves 450 children annually. Request: \$25,000.

## Family Promise of South Bay: Welcome Home Kids

Provides funding for children and their families when they transition into sustainable housing. Families typically don't have any furnishings when they do find a home and sometimes have difficulty paying upfront costs. Funds would be used for housing assistance, cribs, crib sheets, twin mattresses, twin box springs, twin metal frames, mattress covers, pillows, pillow protectors, sheets, towels, curtains, child-safe furniture, new or gently used household goods and appliances. The cost of a rental truck for two days, gas, and mileage. In addition, gift cards from budget-minded department stores, will be distributed for other key necessities. Serves 30-45 children annually. Request: \$20,000.

## Community's Child: Healthy Bags Program

Community's Child provides nutritious foods to more than 250 impoverished food insecure children (and their siblings) attending elementary schools in the South West portion of the South Bay. Every Friday that school is in session, we deliver bags of nutritious groceries to the schools where the public health nurses, special education teachers, social workers and Principles have identified attending children as being at risk for hunger and malnutrition on the weekends, in their family homes. During the summer months when the schools and their breakfast and lunch programs are closed, we provide up to 500 local food insecure children with bags of nutritious groceries and health education services every three weeks. Serves 1,200 children weekly Request: \$20,000

#### Marine Mammal Care: Mobile Visitors Center - Educational Access

Request that Las Candalistas fund up to 8 Mobile Visitors Center trips to South Bay schools and/or community events where children will definitely be present. Each trip includes up to 6 hours of on-site presence of the Mobile Visitors Center, at least 2 MMCC Los Angeles personnel to act as educational docents, and an on-site or take-home educational activity that is age appropriate. Las Candalistas is welcome to recommend 8 sites, or MMCC Los Angeles can select sites with many children who may not be able to visit our hospital in person, or the school / community group cannot afford to host the Mobile Visitors Center. Each visit is \$2,500. Serves 8,000-12,000 children annually Request: \$20,000

#### Toberman Neighborhood Center: Toberman's Summer Academy

Toberman wishes to use these funds to support Summer Academy activities during 2019. Summer Academy provides activities to build developmental assets and instruction to build literacy, writing and math skills. The program strives to maintain or increase academic skills over the summer months and directly address summer learning loss. Also, through a daily focus on the Search Institutes 40 Developmental Assets, children develop those protective resiliency skills they may need to thrive. Additionally, Summer Academy is focused on Learning Within and Beyond the Classroom. Field trips are conducted two days each week for the children to explore the many community resources available in the Harbor Area. Each trip is directly linked to academic lessons learned in the classroom which allows experimental learning to occur. Toberman also plans to add a new recreational component to Summer Academy which is designed to increase physical activity levels, improve self-esteem and combat the growing obesity problem in children. Serves 90-100 children. Request: \$10,000

## TrinityKids Care Hospice: TrinityKids Care Necessities of Life

Hospice and palliative care for children. We recognize that children require more complex levels of care due to the nature and complexity of their illness and age. While it is difficult to accept that there are children who needs these end-of-life services, the specialized team of clinicians who serve children with life-limiting illness and their families through the TrinityKids Care program are committed to the provision of these services. We are honored to be "invited into homes" to provide guidance, love, support and compassion so critically needed by the children, as well as their family members and friends. Serves 300-400 Request: \$10,000

These items are to assist Community's Child in preparing Thanksgiving dinner packages that will be distributed to those in need. If you are unable to attend their upcoming Harvest Festival on Saturday, October 27<sup>th</sup>, please bring items from the list to the October meeting. I will be delivering all of the collected food items to the Harvest Festival.
