*Gifts and Gracious Giving* Bidding for Good is making me sooo proud! The core group of Chair Debbie Sampson (and myself) together with Laura Henson-Broussard, Janis Davis and Karen Stockbridge, all did the hard work to bring this beautiful event forward. Members stepped up at several stages and levels. I couldn't be prouder. The Online Auction will become live October 15th through November 1st. As the event proceeds, be sure to check in and see what can tempt you. Once things are purchased, a process has been set in place for delivery or mailing. Thanks to the folks on that end as well because happy recipients are our final goal.

Very special Themed Tables are not only designed by members, but also photographed and turned into short videos. There will be a Members Only sale, with some Holiday Treasures. This will follow the *Gifts and Gracious Giving* Bidding for Good sale, including some items that do not sell online. This sale will be held at the home of Jennifer Sittel on November 13. Please be assured that we are paying close attention to scheduling times for members to attend, and emphasizing social distancing and wearing masks.

Be certain to put your orders in for Friends and Family jams, jellies and breads. The members doing this are only going to make what is ordered, so there will be no last-minute gift buying. They have been chopping jalapenos and searching for cherries (the normal source was not available) to be ready for this presentation.

Through the efforts of our Chairwoman of the Board of Directors and in cooperation with Kris Stafford who works for Palos Verdes Peninsula Unified School District, a Storage Container at Rancho del Mar High School has been permitted for our use! (It's FREE) It is near the Palos Verdes Peninsula Unified School District maintenance location and, I'm told, the print shop. It is relatively close to Crenshaw Blvd and Crest Road intersection, heading east on Crest. This will be for what I am calling "One Touch Items," those things we use only for the Spring Event, and some being kept for historical purposes, such as older notebooks. This space is intended for longer term, but still temporary, storage. We are still looking for more permanent placement. This will give us a chance to deeper clean the LL storage room, and to curate what we keep in both places.

Several women joined in the effort after the September General Meeting to begin the work of sorting the signs previously created for the Events. While none were yet thrown away, many were consolidated and tied so that the space taken up was reduced. There are even more than I saw at first glance. Does anyone know who is connected to the California signs or the Artist's Palette signs? Please contact me as I may want to put these into the Members' Only sale, for yard art or memorabilia. Also, unless I hear from someone wanting to save the rustic, rough wood signs, I am going to find a better place for those, as well.

I am still looking for someone willing to scan notebooks. This is a project that will be done over time, and there are a lot of other things going on at this time, so the amount of work will be spread out. The project does not need to be done only by one person, either. If you are willing to do even one, it will shorten our shelf load.

This is a very challenging time. There are so many currents pulling us in different directions. I am grateful to all of you who attended the September General Meeting (44) and to all who are finding a way to be "UP for the Challenge!"

#### **October Meeting**

We look forward to seeing all Las Candalistas members at our upcoming General Meeting on Wednesday, October 14<sup>th</sup>. This meeting will be held via Zoom video conferencing. In lieu of having our Top 6 charities present their primary requests in person, we've opted to have each of them submit a video presentation instead. Although we're unable to meet face-to-face, this year's presentations will instead give us a virtual 'peek' inside each of our Top 6 charities. You should

plan to walk away from this experience with a deeper appreciation for all of the tireless work these organizations do on a daily basis for the less fortunate.

### November Vote and Voting Requirements

As we did last year, voting for our Top 3 charities will be held at our November general meeting. With voting being held online, the results of this important vote will be released either late day or the following morning. As always, it is mandatory that we have a quorum (greater than 50% of our voting members) in attendance at this meeting before I can release the ballots. I will be taking attendance to confirm that we have met this requirement.

#### Video Conferencing Instructions

To assist members with accessing our meetings via Zoom, follow the next steps. You will need to download the Zoom app from your Play Store. If you do not have the Zoom application downloaded to your device beforehand, you will be prompted to download and install Zoom when you click the link provided by our President, Paula Tuckerman, to join the meeting. 
I also thought it may be helpful to send you a little info on finding and understanding the Mute and Camera buttons on Zoom. To find the buttons, you may need to tap the screen or hover your mouse to make the menu appear. On your cell or computer, the menu is at the bottom of the screen. If you are on an iPad it is at the top. Just tap the icon to turn them on or off. The microphone icon controls whether or not everyone can hear you (and anything around you). It's labeled Mute, Unmute or Audio depending if it is on or off.

Additionally, the video camera icon controls whether or not everyone can see you, it's labeled Start Video or Stop Video depending if it is on or off.

#### Zoom on a Cell Phone or Tablet

The icons will be **black and white** if they are on or they will be **red** with a line through it if they are off.

In the screenshots below, the microphone is on = everyone can hear you (black and white). And the video camera is off = no one can see you (red with line through it).



#### Zoom on a Computer

The icons will be **black and white** if they are on, <u>or</u> they will have a **red line** through them if they are off. There are a few computer screenshots below showing the icons turned on and off.




The red circle on the microphone means there's an error with the audio and no one can hear you. The red line through the video camera means it is off and no one can see you either.



The microphone is off = no one can hear you (red line). The camera is off = no one can see you (red line).



The microphone is on = everyone can hear you (black and white). The camera is off = no one can see you (red line).

### PHILANTHROPY NEWS

We have had a busy month preparing for the October general meeting. Because of the Covid-19 pandemic, L.A. County continues to have strict guidelines which have eliminated large group gatherings/meetings. Meetings will continue on the Zoom app and have been very successful. Typically, at the October general meeting the Top 6 charities make a live presentation to our members. Those presentations have generally been well-attended and are always of great value as we watch and listen to each presentation.

This year, when we congratulated our Top 6, we explained that due to COVID, we were requiring that they submit a video presentation in lieu of our ability to meet in person. The charities were each given ideas on what to cover in their video. Each charity has submitted an 8-minute video covering their purpose, needs, goals, and the number of children served by their primary program request. They have even shared an actual look inside of their current project(s)/program(s). These

videos are not professional, but rather serve as an informative, visual experience that we think you will all enjoy.

Ladies ... please attend the **General Meeting on October 14th at 9:20 via Zoom**. If you need help accessing Zoom, please ask for help. In September we had approximately 44 members at the General Meeting. It is an opportunity to see each other as well as listen to our charities' presentations and learn more about all the activity going on with Las Candalistas and our fall fundraising activities.

### Top 6 Charities and Primary Programs (in no particular order):

### 1736 Family Crisis Center Primary Program: South Bay Children's Mental Health Program Request Amount: \$9,660.00 Program Serves: 125 Children Annually

Supervised by licensed therapists, this program combines age and developmentally appropriate mental health therapy, including clinical assessment and treatment with therapeutic activities (e.g. psychotherapy, art, and play therapy). Most children show progress against well-defined behavioral, psychological and familial improvement measures. Children learn to increase their coping skills and reach positive developmental milestones.

1736 Family Crisis Center offers emergency and rehabilitative services for extremely vulnerable and often injured clientele who are fleeing life-threatening circumstances. Covid-19 has intensified the need for services as 12% of homeless persons in the South Bay are children under 18 years of age and 26% of homeless persons report an experience with domestic violence. With a network of 24 residential and community-based service sites located throughout Los Angeles and Orange counties, the centers serve directly approximately 9,000 clients annually. The mission is to comprehensively help children, women, men and families through crisis circumstances including domestic violence, homelessness, abuse, neglect, poverty, substance use, post-traumatic stress disorder and distress, and to improve their prospects for long-term housing, safety, survival, financial stability, and success.

### Boys and Girls Club-Harbor City Primary Program: Extended School Day Request Amount: \$20,000 Program Serves: 1000 Children

Due to Covid-19, LAUSD schools are continuing virtual learning through the Fall of 2020. The Boys and Girls Clubs of the L.A. Harbor will support families by opening for full-day learning. Students will arrive in the morning to Club sites. Staff focused on academics and tutoring will work with members to complete on-line lessons and homework. In the afternoon, Program Staff for traditional arts will provide academic and athletic activities along with College and Career Bound Pathway Programming.

At this time, the Boys & Girls Clubs of the LA Harbor does not have the number of computers/tablets needed to provide on-line education to every member. Help from Las Candalistas with a grant of \$20,000 will provide the funding needed to purchase 50 Laptop computers and 10 iPads that will be utilized at their Harbor City location. Your support of our Extended School Day

will ensure the underserved and at-risk youth who live in Harbor City have computers to support requirements for them to attend school. In addition, the iPads can be used by both staff and students for on-line programming and career and college research and exploration. They will also be used to create curriculum and projects for Earth Day, and teach exploration and career path programming in aquatic robotics and traditional STEM education.

### Community's Child Primary Program: Healthy Bags Request Amount \$20,000 Program Serves: 260 individuals

The purpose of this organization is to help their communities end child hunger and to improve health, social, and academic development of their clients in order that they can acquire successful education and move themselves and their children out of poverty. Before COVID, the Healthy Bags Program delivered nutritious weekend groceries to 250 food-insecure children and their siblings (900 individuals). Normally, the food bags were delivered every Friday to different school sites to later be picked up by the families. Currently, the number of families in need has increased. Community's Child now provides food donations for 1,500 individuals in the South Bay. Families stand in line on Friday to receive their food. Funding is for the Healthy Bags Program.

### Family Promise of the South Bay Primary Program: E-Learning Engagement and Support Request Amount: \$20,000 Program Serves: 260 individuals and now includes e-learning.

Family Promise of the South Bay helps newly homeless children & their families find affordable, safe, and sustainable housing. They believe that no child should have to sleep in a car, in a park, or under a bridge, and that every family deserves a chance to be whole and have a roof over their heads. One aspect of cyclical poverty is the learning gap that exists between the socio-economic classes that exist in this country.

They have developed an on-site program that now includes e-learning. They believe they can utilize their resources to minimize the learning gap with the students in the program. They are supporting children as well as their families in the e-learning process so that each student receives their grade level instruction and opportunity to succeed. Family Promise provides tutoring, computers (computer repair), family/child education required for e-learning success and small family group assistance in the early evening. Their staff is very positive about the results of the e-learning program.

### Harbor Interfaith Services Primary Program: The Children's Center Request Amount: \$10,000 Program Serves: 132+ individuals

Harbor Interfaith Services provides services for the homeless and working poor across the South Bay. Their mission is to help their clients achieve self-sufficiency by providing support services including shelter, transitional housing, food, job placement, advocacy, childcare, education, and lifeskills training. Their Children's Center offers licensed daycare, preschool, and after school care for up to 80 infants, toddlers, preschoolers and school-aged children. Parents must attend school, look for work or be employed to enroll a child. There are few other options for these families

### WYLAND Foundation Primary Program: WYLAND Clean Water Mobile Learning Center Request Amount: \$15,000 Program Serves: 15,000 Children Annually (Grades 3-7)

WYLAND Foundation is dedicated to promoting, protecting, and preserving the world's oceans, waterways, and marine life. The vision is a world where clean water and a healthy ocean is sustained forever by knowledgeable, compassionate people around the world. The foundation encourages environmental awareness through traveling environmental science education, arts programs, and community-based volunteer engagement.

The WYLAND Mobile Learning Exhibit (MLE) is a state-of-the-art, 1,000 sq. ft., bio-diesel learning exhibition on wheels, featuring a 40-person multi-sensory theater and six interactive stations. This exhibit is like no other and delivers a museum-quality science experience that allows students to explore how the quality and availability of water affects the quality of our lives. Every year the MLE provides a unique mobile laboratory for 15,000 students, grades 3-7, to promote the study of local and global water quality and supply, ranging from the future of water as a shared resource to the impacts of polluted runoff on our coasts and waterways. Using STEM-based lessons, interactive exhibits, and post-event activities, students in traditional and underserved communities discover current environmental problems, including eutrophication (ecosystem response to the addition of substances) and nonpoint pollution, and behavioral strategies to reduce their community impact. Covid-19 and social distancing has been implemented with the MLE.
