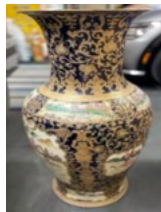

***This month we are excited to highlight the wonderful things that are happening with two more of our charities, Los Serenos de Point Vicente and Los Angeles Maritime Institute.***



***Jay Fodor sends Las Candalistas his greetings and these updates:***

The docents of Los Serenos de Point Vicente are pleased to announce that in 2022 we are again offering educational field trips to our local schools after a 2-year delay due to the pandemic. For the 2021-2022 academic year we have already scheduled 27 field trips for children ranging in ages from 7 to 17 years old. These field trips are held at the tide pools at Abalone Cove, the hiking trails at the Forrestal Nature Preserve, and in our museum at the Point Vicente Interpretive Center. Included in these field trips are 5 outings for the Title 1 schools that are part of our Whale of a World (WOW) Program. Thanks to the generous donations from Las Candalistas, we will be hosting over 200 children for these WOW trips this year. As pandemic-caused restrictions are gradually being lifted at LAUSD schools, we fully expect that we will be back to conducting our typical 15-20 WOW field trips in the 2022-2023 school year.

Los Serenos, along with the City of Rancho Palos Verdes, will again be holding our popular Whale of a Day (WOAD) Event in-person on April 9, 2022. This event is held at the Point Vicente Interpretive Center and is Los Serenos' major fundraiser each year. One of the highlights of previous WOADs has been the presentation of our popular puppet show. Our puppet show program has been made possible by Las Candalistas' past support to our educational programs. This year will be the debut live performance of our new show titled "Guillermo Goes to Mexico". We are also pleased to announce that we are developing a new show titled "Coastal Adventures with the Good, the Bugs, and the Ugly" that expands the Puppet Show Program by offering an outreach traveling science-based show designed to be performed at elementary schools targeting Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade students. This highly interactive presentation will focus on the native habitat of the Palos Verdes Peninsula, and features hands on lessons about pollination, insect life cycle, and local plants and animals. The docents of Los Serenos de Point Vicente would like to thank Las Candalistas for your contributions to our programs. Much of what we do would not have been possible without your generous support.

Transformative youth education at sea is back with a splash! With COVID restrictions lifted, Los Angeles Maritime Institute (affectionately known as LAMI) is once again empowering children with engaging educational experiences onboard its three sailing tall ships, connecting youth to the ocean, their peers, and to their own limitless abilities! While successfully pivoting to provide engaging online maritime and STEM courses to more than 4,600 area youth during last year's school shut-downs, LAMI is finally able to deliver its transformative TopSail Youth Program to schools and youth groups in person and at sea! Since the start of the 2021-2022 school year, 750 students from the Los Angeles area have set sail aboard LAMI's TopSail Youth Program, with more than 40 school classes already scheduled to participate during the remainder of Spring. TopSail is offered to 5th-12th-grade youth from under-resourced communities and Title 1 schools free of charge to ensure all children gain the proven academic and personal development that comes from this uniquely immersive experiential learning opportunity. The Program curriculum is tailored to the school or organization's needs and can range from a 3-hour sail to a multi-day and night

voyage. Activities aboard LAMI's majestic multi-masted 100+ ft wooden sailing ships safely challenge students to work together setting sails, conducting environmental science, and navigating the waters off our coast. Young participants disembark TopSail with a stronger grasp of academics, a pride in environmental stewardship, an empowered belief in oneself, and a new perspective of the world and their future possibilities. Thanks to Las Candalistas and its caring Members, LAMI's TopSail Youth Program is back on the water and ready to serve more youth who otherwise wouldn't have access to this enriching experience!
