Items needed are clothing for Men, Women and Children and small household items. Please make sure all clothing is clean and in good condition and that all appliances are in working condition.



PHILANTHROPY

It's that time in our Las Candalistas' year when we distribute our funds to our Top 3 Charities, 1736 Family Crisis Center, Community's Child and Friends of Cabrillo Aquarium and determine what additional funds are available for our other 14 nominated charities. We have had a tremendous fund-raising year and are so excited about what we will be able to do.

We invite you to attend our **Philanthropy Distribution Meeting on Monday, June 6th** at 1:00 PM at the Palos Verdes Library (same room as our General Meeting). Please come if you would like to advocate for your favorite charity. We will send an eblast before the Meeting to you remind you of each charity's program and monetary request.

Our Top 3 will be presented with their checks during our June luncheon.

It's also the time when we begin accepting nominations for our 2022-2023 Charities. The nomination form can be found attached to this newsletter and in the Member's Only section of the LC website.. We will also have the forms at our General Meeting. Remember, you will need two additional signatures on your submitted nomination. This month we would like to highlight Providence TrinityKids. Kristin Conforti shared this update with us.



As the only pediatric hospice and palliative care program serving Los Angeles and Orange Counties, TrinityKids Care is essential. Without it, children would spend their last days in a hospital, away from the familiar

comforts of home, their pets, and the things they love most. Parents and siblings would have to navigate the illness without the invaluable emotional support and full scope of medical care that we provide. Our last census has the largest number of children served to date at 86.

As families come on service, a financial assessment is completed to ensure fundamental needs are met. These needs can range from complete Patient Care Assistance (charity care) to providing basic services including rental assistance, phone or utility bills, food vouchers, and medical supplies (Necessities of Life). Approximately 15% of our families are provided with these services.

When we put one child on service, we care for an entire family. Social services and counseling are available to all members of the family, from parents, grandparents and most especially siblings. We have art therapy programs specifically designed for children. So, when you look at the number of children served, it's much more than just the ill child.

It is important to note that hospice care does not end with the death of a loved one. Bereavement support services are provided for 13-months beyond the loss giving families an appropriate setting in which to express their grief fully. Survivor services include home visits, one-on-one counseling by hospice clinical social workers; on-going telephone support by trained bereavement volunteers; access to our bereavement support groups; get-togethers designed to help survivors cope with approaching anniversaries and holidays.

We would love to ask for in-kind donations of gift cards for our Necessities of Life Program, Target and grocery are best. The demand has increased for our families, due to the dual burden of the impacts of the pandemic and their child's terminal illness. We are endlessly grateful for you shining your bright light on our families, thank you! Please bring donations to our May General Meeting on My 11th.
