We have had an *exciting* and *very busy* September preparing for our October 12<sup>th</sup> General Meeting. We congratulated our Top 6 charities and invited Representatives from each to speak at our Meeting to present their mission and the primary program for which they have requested funding. Following these presentations, and after the representatives have left, we will have a few minutes for members to share any additional facts/experiences they may have. Voting for the Top 3 will take place after any discussion. We have also asked each charity to prepare an 8-minute video highlighting their purpose, needs, and goals. Their videos will be available for members to view a few days before the meeting, so keep an eye out for our eblast. We know that you will enjoy this 'wonderful visual peek' into all that our amazing charities do to support children and the environment.

A summary of each charity is provided here. 1736 Family Crisis Center offers emergency and rehabilitative services for extremely vulnerable and often injured clientele who are fleeing life-threatening circumstances. With a network of 21 residential and community-based service sites located throughout Los Angeles and Orange counties, they directly serve approximately 9,000 clients annually. Their mission is to comprehensively help children, women, men, and families through crisis circumstances including domestic violence, homelessness, abuse, neglect, poverty, post-traumatic stress disorder and distress, and to improve their prospects for long-term housing, safety, survival, financial stability, and success. **Primary Request \$9,280 for South Bay Children's Mental Health Program. Serves 125 youth annually.** This program is supervised by licensed therapists and combines age- and developmentally appropriate mental health therapy, including case work, clinical assessment, and treatment with therapeutic activities (e.g., psychotherapy, art and play therapy).



Community's Child's purpose is to end child hunger in our community & improve health, social & academic development; to provide impoverished children & families with supports

necessary to acquire successful educations and move out of poverty; to provide homeless women & children a safe structured shelter to heal from trauma and obtain the skills to become self-sufficient. Community's Child provides impoverished South Bay children with free weekly nutritious groceries, annual school supplies, laptops and tutoring services, new books, health, dental and vision screenings and services, masks, hand sanitizers, clothing, shoes, diapers, and hygiene products, Zoom support and counseling services. **Primary Request \$20,000 for their Healthy Bags - COVID Response and Inflation Relief program. Serves 900-1800 food insecure children per week.** The program provides weekly delivery to schools and/or has children & families pick up nutritious groceries, personal care items, school supplies, and laptops and provides access to counseling and educational programs.

Cabrillo Marine Aquarium is a facility of the City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks. It is important that everyone has access to its programs regardless of the ability to pay. Although donations are accepted, entry is always free. Friends of Cabrillo Marine Aquarium is a non-profit that exists solely to provide support and resources to Cabrillo Marine Aquarium's mission, which is "to serve as a trusted resource that inspires exploration, respect and conservation of Southern California marine life."

**Primary Request: \$10,000 for their General Education and Outreach Program; Serves 300,000.** One of their signature programs is *Ocean Outreach*: The specially equipped saltwater tank vans bring the ocean to students at local schools throughout Southern

California, reaching up to 25,000 students annually. This unique, hands-on marine science and environmental education program is offered to children ages pre-K through 8th grade throughout the school year. Additional Programs include *School Tours*, *Spring Outdoor Classroom*, *Sea Search Marine Biology Workshops*, *Aquaculture and Research Lab*, *Junior/Senior High Docents*, and *Public Programs* such as Whale Fiesta, Earth Day, and Autumn Sea Fair.



Manes for Movement's mission is to help improve function and positively change the lives of children and adults with disabilities using Equine (horse) Assisted Therapies and Activities. Currently they offer a full continuum of services from recreational adaptive horseback riding lessons

to medically based therapy interventions like Hippotherapy that address functional goals, such as walking, talking, sensory processing, and more. Manes for Movement is the only therapeutic riding facility within 40 miles of the South Bay that provides both medically based Hippotherapy services, and recreational Adaptive Horseback Riding to the community under the same program roof. In 2021 Manes for Movement provided over 1200 hours of direct service hours to children and adults with disabilities. **Primary Request \$15,000 for their Equine Assisted Therapy and recreational Programming. Serves 40+ children per week.** Their current programming includes- 1. Medically based Hippotherapy sessions directed by licensed physical and occupational therapists; 2. Feeding therapy and Assistive Technology training with a licensed occupational therapist; 3. Recreational adaptive horseback riding lessons overseen by a PATH Intl certified

therapeutic riding instructor; 4. Ground based therapeutic horsemanship programs; 5. Adaptive Riding Horse Show team that participates in local horse shows and competitions.



SBCHC was founded in 1947 to fill the gaps in health care services accessible and available to low-income and underserved children, teens, and young adults throughout the South Bay. In their earlier years the organization offered a variety of child and adolescent focused services including well-baby care, hearing and vision services, mental health, and dental care. Today, the primary focus is on improving the mental health and overall health and wellness of underserved and at-risk children, teens, and young adults through the provision of quality dental and mental health services - both high priority needs in the South Bay communities of Los Angeles. South Bay Children's Health Center serves the dental and mental health needs of low-income or at-risk children, teens, and young adults; empowering them to live healthy, productive, and happy lives. **Primary request \$15,000 for their South Bay Children's Health Center's Dental Program. Serves 4,600 youth.** The program offers high-quality preventative, restorative and emergency dental treatment and age-based anticipatory oral health education and guidance to underserved and low-income youth in the South Bay in the type of "dental home" environment recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics.



**WYLAND  
FOUNDATION**

Founded in 1993, the Wyland Foundation, is dedicated to promoting, protecting, and preserving the world's ocean, waterways, and marine life. Their vision is a world where clean water and a healthy ocean is sustained forever by knowledgeable, compassionate people around the world. The foundation encourages environmental awareness by bringing communities together and inspiring thousands of people each year to become more positive, solution-oriented stewards of our global marine resources. They accomplish this through traveling environmental science education, arts programs, and community-based volunteer engagement programs. **Primary request \$25,000 for their Wyland Clean Water Mobile Learning Center. Serves 15,000 youth per year.** The Wyland Mobile Learning Exhibit (MLE) is a state-of-the-art 1,000 sq. biodiesel learning exhibition on wheels features a 40- person multi-sensory theater and six interactive stations. Every year the MLE provides a unique mobile laboratory for 15,000 students, grades 3-7, to promote the study of local and global water quality and supply, ranging from the future of water as a shared resource to the impacts of polluted runoff on our coasts and waterways.

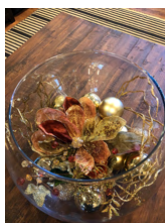

### **Social Media:**

**Email Marketing (Constant Contact):**

We have been using Constant Contact for email marketing for several years. I wanted to explain what this is, for those of you who are not familiar with it.

Constant Contact is an email marketing company that will send out emails for your organization. They have professional templates and the ability to send mass emails. If you subscribe to receive emails from your favorite stores, you have most likely received emails via Constant Contact.

We utilize Constant Contact mostly to advertise our events. In fact, our most recent fundraising event, 'Starry Starry Night at the Ranch,' used Constant Contact as the primary advertising source (along with a follow-up postcard)

All LC members are on the Constant Contact email list so any time one is sent out, you will receive it. You can, in turn, forward it on to friends, which helps us spread the word.

However, often times emails sent through companies like Constant Contact can wind up in your Promotions box or Spam box rather than your Primary inbox.
