After visiting, we all affirmed how excited we are to be supporting the only program within 40 miles that offers Hippotherapy services, and recreational Adaptive Horseback Riding, to the community under the same program roof.

Manes for Movement has continued to grow and flourish over the last year, bringing joy and quality equine assisted services to our clients. We are currently serving approximately 45 clients per week and provided over 1800+ direct service hours in 2022. This last year Manes for Movement became a vendor with Harbor Regional Center, which has opened the door for numerus community members with disabilities and special needs to take part in our recreational adaptive horseback riding program. In fact, demand for our services has been so great that we currently have over 60 people on our waiting list for services! Manes for Movement's herd has expanded to 5 horses, plus Bobby the miniature horse, to help try to address the significant need for quality equine assisted therapies and recreational activities we have in the South Bay Community. We have also launched our ground-based horsemanship program, where children and adults who would not otherwise be able to ride are able to experience the benefits of horsemanship activities with our therapy horses. We would like to extend a huge thank you to Las Candalistas for your generosity and continued support of our programming! Your continued support allows us to continue to grow year after year and do more for our disability and special needs community.

# This month we are looking forward to hearing from Jay Fodor and all that Los Serenos de Point Vicente has been up to in recent months.

Here is a quick update from Jay:

Los Serenos de Point Vicente is an all-volunteer organization which provides educational and outreach services on behalf of the city of Rancho Palos Verdes (RPV).

Our services include providing docent support to the Point Vicente Interpretive Center (PVIC) museum, leading school children on field trips which focus on the local environment, habitats, and local history, and organizing weekend outreach events and nature walks for the public.

Although many of our activities were slowed down because of restrictions due to the pandemic, 2023 is shaping up to be a very busy year for our docents. During the 2022-2023 academic year, 38 field trips for local children have been scheduled. We have been busily hosting children of all ages, from 2nd graders through high schoolers, on tours of PVIC and on nature walks on our local hiking trails. Due in part to generous donations from Las Candalistas, 14 of these field trips are for schools who participate in our Whale of a World (WOW)program. The WOW program focuses on providing the buses and educational materials for hands on learning experiences on our natural habitat for children grades 2-6 and is offered to all title 1 schools in the Los Angeles area.

We also will be offering 12 public nature walks on our local trails in 2023, including a beach clean-up at Abalone Cove as part of the International Coastal Clean Up day in September. You are welcome to join us at any of these public events.

In February we started the training of 12 high school students, who are part of our popular Jr Docent program. The program offers high school students community service opportunities and strives to instill in the students an understanding and appreciation for the dynamics and fragility of the natural world around them.

In addition, we are pleased to announce that our docents are once again welcoming guests to the Point Vicente Interpretive Center Museum, which is now open for visitors after a 5-month shut down due to water damage caused by a broken water pipe. We are especially excited to be showing off our new exhibit, a 15 ft Sperm Whale Jawbone which was generously donated to Los Serenos. Sperm whales are the largest toothed whales and were recently spotted off the coast in the Los Angeles area.

The whale watchers at PVIC have also been spotting many migrating Pacific Gray Whales recently, so it would be a good time for you to stop by PVIC for a tour. We would love to host you. If this isn't enough, Los Serenos and the city of RPV will once again be hosting Whale of a Day at PVIC on April 16. This event, which focuses on the migration of the Pacific Gray Whale and other environmental topics, is a popular event which features informative booths, arts and crafts, children's games, and food trucks. If you attend, be looking for our puppeteers, who will be located around the grounds with their puppets, teaching children in a fun way about our local ocean habitat. Our puppet program is another activity made possible through the support of Las Candalistas. The docents of Los Serenos de Point Vicente would like to again thank Las Candalistas for your contributions to our programs. Much of what we do would not have been possible without your generous support.
