HISTORY LESSON #1: The First Walk


1967: Las Candalistas was founded.

April 3, 1970: Las Candalistas hosts its first Walk on the Wildside. This annual spring event would become so successful that our name would become synonymous with Walk on the Wildside. People may not have known the name Las Candalistas, but they knew Walk on the Wildside! The first Walk was one day, a Friday. It would later develop into two days, Thursday and Saturday, and at its peak, 1400 tickets would be sold, 700 each day. In the beginning, it was a true guided nature walk through the wilds of Portuguese Bend, its purpose (in addition to fundraise) was to showcase the beauty of the Palos Verdes Peninsula. It would eventually evolve into a nature walk with stations where our members would perform skits pertaining to whatever the theme of that Walk was. Of course, a gourmet lunch, made by members, was served among the wildflowers. And we would sell our member created items and baked goods.

By the time I joined Las Candalistas in 2005, Walk on the Wildside, still our only fundraiser at the time, had moved to the grounds of RPV City Hall. We were no longer able to hold our event in Portuguese Bend. It was still a lovely and well-attended event. But it was probably the beginning of the end of the Walk, in my opinion. The Las Candalistas of today may no longer have a Walk on the Wildside, but our Spring event (and now Fall Event) still have the 'sparkle' from long ago. And we still have many loyal followers from our Walk days.

Proceeds from this annual event will go to the Child Guidance Clinic of the South Bay Children's Health Center in Redondo Beach.
