We will need a quorum.**

To give you all some clarification on what the difference is between a Standing Rule and a Bylaw: Bylaws refer to the general regulations and rules established by a company or other organization for internal management.

Standing Rules are more administrative and specific.

For example:

Bylaws state when the meetings of an organization are held.

Standing Rules tell where and what time these meetings are held.

Bylaws give primary responsibilities of the officers and BOD.

Standing Rules give the specifics.

For your information, our current standing rules are printed in your roster. Bylaws are available by request.

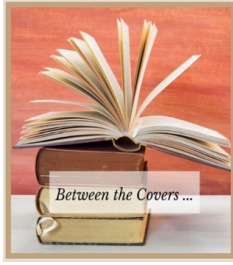

HISTORY LESSON #3: THE SOUP SUPPER

I was excited to see that this year's Provisionals were including soups and chilis in their Fall Social. I recall my Fall Social when I was a Provisional, in 2005 (!) with fondness. Back then, we were still doing the "traditional" Soup Supper where the Provisionals were split into groups and each group made a soup together. They would then serve their soup to members at the event. The theme was always a harvest or Halloween theme. I still remember how fun it was to make Butternut Squash soup at Marcia Butler's home. We stopped calling the event the Soup Supper and started using Fall Social instead a few years back. If I remember correctly, it was because we had some years where we just didn't have enough Provisionals to put on a proper Soup Supper. Subsequently, the event evolved into a Fall Social, where the Provisionals could choose what they wanted to do and what their theme would be. However, the purpose remains the same: to introduce our provisional class to the rest of the membership in a fun, social setting, and, for the Provisionals to get to know the other members of their Provisional "Class" by working together, planning, and creating a "mini-event". It is a great way for us to kick off our season!
