WEBSITE, SOCIAL MEDIA AND EMAIL MARKETING (CONSTANT CONTACT)

Have you seen the new and improved LC website? www.lascandalistas.org. Please check it out! There are two parts to our site: a Public portion and a Members Only portion. The Public portion promotes us, our events, our current projects, etc. The Members Only portion is just for us. It has a calendar and all the documents you need such as check requests, deposit forms, newsletters, and more. To access it you need to register. Click on the menu at the top of our website, scroll down to Register and follow the instructions. I (Laura HB) will have to approve you. Once you are approved, you can then log in. A code may be sent to your email for security reasons.

Social Media:

We have two Facebook pages accounts: a public and private one:

Public Facebook Page: please like our page and like and share our posts. Type in Las Candalistas in the search bar to find us.

Private Facebook Page: This is for Las Candalistas Members Only (please don't confuse this with our website Members Only section). We use this to post photos of LC social events, share info about our philanthropies and more. Type in Las Candalistas Members in the search bar to find this page. You have to ask to join.

Instagram: Type in lascandalistas in the search bar to find us. Click on follow. Like our posts!

Email Marketing (Constant Contact):

We have been using Constant Contact for email marketing for several years. I want to explain what this is, for those of you who are not familiar with it.

Constant Contact is an email marketing company that will send out emails for your organization. They have professional templates and the ability to send mass emails. If you subscribe to receive emails from your favorite stores, you have most likely received emails via Constant Contact. We utilize Constant Contact mostly to advertise our events. In fact, our most recent fundraising events, used Constant Contact as the primary advertising source (along with a follow-up postcard)

All LC members are on the Constant Contact email list so any time one is sent out, you will receive it. You can, in turn, forward it on to friends, which helps us spread the word. However, often times emails sent through companies like Constant Contact can wind up in your Promotions box or Spam box rather than your Primary inbox. So please check all your inboxes to make sure you haven't missed an email. If you have gmail, please check your Promotions tab, it will most likely go there. You can also add lascandalistas@gmail.com to your contact list. That will help.

RECIPE FROM THE LAS CANDALISTAS ARCHIVES

The holidays are coming! And that means a lot of baking. I'm not a fruitcake fan (is anybody?) but I found this recipe in the *Recipes from Our Fair Ladies of Las Candalistas* book. I'd try this one. I trust our LC ladies!

*F*RUITCAKE HATER'S FRUITCAKE

Fruitcake

3 lg. navel oranges	1 tsp. vanilla
1 c. dried cranberries	3 c. all-purpose flour
½ c. golden raisins	1 tsp. baking soda
½ c. currants	½ tsp. ground cinnamon
½ c. chopped dried apricots	¼ tsp. ground ginger
2 c. granulated sugar	¼ tsp. ground nutmeg
1 c. butter, room temp.	1 c. buttermilk
4 eggs	1 c. chopped walnuts

Preheat oven to 325° F. Butter and flour a 10" tube pan. Grate zest from oranges to make 3 T. for cake and 2 tsp. for icing. Squeeze oranges to yield ⅔ c. juice for cake and ¼ c. for icing. Set aside. In medium saucepan, combine dried cranberries, raisins, currants, apricots and the ⅔ c. orange juice. Bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer 5 minutes or until fruit is plumped. Drain well; set aside. In large mixer bowl, cream sugar and butter until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well. Add 3 T. grated orange zest and the vanilla; beat well. Alternately add combined dry ingredients (flour, soda, cinnamon, ginger, and nutmeg) and buttermilk to the creamed mixture, beginning and ending with flour mixture. Stir in walnuts and fruit. Pour batter into prepared pan. Bake about 1 hour and 15 minutes, or until golden brown and a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pan 10 minutes. Remove to wire rack; cool well.

Icing

1 (8-oz.) pkg. cream cheese, room temp	6 T. confectioners sugar
--	--------------------------

Beat together cream cheese and confectioners sugar until smooth. Add the ¼ cup orange juice and the 2 tsp. orange zest; beat well. Spread icing on top of cake. Garnish with additional dried fruit, if desired.

Recipe Note: Icing is not necessary, but is a nice topping if you desire. Cake can be made five days ahead; cover and refrigerate. Bring to room temp 30 minutes before serving. To freeze, wrap tightly in freezer wrap, heavy-duty aluminum foil, or plastic freezer-safe bags. Freeze up to two months. Bring to room temp 30 minutes before serving. Yields 10 servings.
